Quotes for toilets – This is on hold until January due to the current climate of financial uncertainty.

6. HT's REPORT

The report gave the school roll as 136 children split between 6 classes. The school has 25% Pupil Premium children. Attendance to date averages 96.42% with Pupil Premium children as a group at 95.3%. CS was asked what measures were in place to deal with absenteeism. CS assured the Governors the school has measures in place to monitor attendance and to promptly contact parents of children whose attendance record is below the average. The school is working closely with some families.

Topic webs are on the website for the Autumn term. Children are showing a positive attitude to learning and behaviour.

Staff training - all staff have undertaken Safeguarding Refresher
Training at the start of this term, First Aid training has been refreshed

and a recent development for the school is the training of an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant undertaken by a member of staff.

CS listed various enrichment activities taking place this term and in September mentioned the children attending the celebration at St Mary's Church in Witney (coach funded by St. Kenelm's School Charity) for the start of the Witney Feast and the Partnership Cross Country Competition in which children from Years 3 to 6 took part.

CS took the Governors through the SEF summary prepared for OFSTED and the Governors

The statement describes the quality of education as Good; Behaviour and Attitudes to be Outstanding, Personal Development to be Good and Leadership and Management to be Good and Early Years to be Good. Reasons were given for these judgements. Governors asked where the school felt improvements could be made to achieve Outstanding and were pleased that areas for focus and improvement were identified to move the school to being Outstanding. The school is striving to achieve this.

Governors asked whether or not areas for development in each of the main OFSTED headings could or should be prioritised.

Looking at Leadership and management CS mentioned the strengths in Governing Body which enable the committees to function effectively.
