



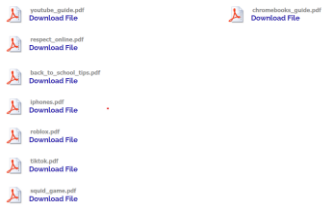

- **There's no network like home**
Public networks are much less secure than home Wi-Fi.
- **Lights out, screens off**
This is a golden rule. Try to limit how much screen time your child has towards the end of the day
- **Keep talking**
Keep having regular chats with your child about who they're talking to online, what they are playing and doing. It doesn't have to be daily but make sure its regular.
