



London's Burning

Year 2 – Wenrisc
Spring Term 2023

Our exciting topic during the Spring term will be explored across the curriculum.



As **Historians** we will learn about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally focusing on London in the 17th Century. We will find out about The Great Fire of London – looking at different sources of evidence to find out what happened and why.

As **Geographers** we will locate the United Kingdom and its countries on a map, globe and atlas. We will also learn the capital cities of the countries which make up the UK.



As **Musicians** we will learn to listen and respond to music through The Carnival of the Animals. In Term 4, pupils will learn about rounds and performing in two parts, listening and responding to a range of 1600's music by composers such as William Byrd.

In maths lessons we will be focusing on the following areas:

- Problem Solving, Reasoning and Algebra

Properties of Shapes / Measurement / Position and Direction

We revisit these areas many times over the year.

PE: PE will be focusing on movement and dance.

Science (enhanced using PZAZ and Explorify)

Uses of Everyday Materials

- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.
- Find out how the shape of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.
- About recycling – which materials can be recycled, the recycling process and why recycling is important.
- About some inventors – John McAdam & Charles Macintosh.



D&T

We will explore what are the best materials from which to make our own model Tudor houses. Using joining skills from last term, we will join materials together to make realistic 3D models and reconstruct Pudding Lane.

Art: This term we will learn how to make secondary colours from primary colours and how to change the tone of a colour. We will mix our topic with art to create some vibrant silhouette pictures of the burning London sky line.

RE: Does everyone celebrate the New Year? What do people believe about God, humanity and the natural world? How should the Church celebrate Easter? How and why are celebrations important in religion?

Computing Making music

We will learn how to create music digitally.

Pictograms – How to efficiently collect and organise data using computers.
