As Historians, pupils will learn about the life of a significant individual from the past who has contributed to national and international achievements. Pupils will use the book, 'Stone Girl Bone Girl' as their starting point and learn about the life of Mary Anning. Pupils will affirm their knowledge through reenactment, artefacts and historical records.

They will develop their observational drawing skills by drawing ammonites and fossils.
