Spring Term 2024

Our exciting topic during the Spring term will be explored across the curriculum.



As **Historians**, we will learn about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally focusing on London in the 17th Century. We will find out about The Great Fire of London – looking at different sources of evidence to find out what happened and why.

As **Geographers**, we will locate the United Kingdom and its countries on a map, globe and atlas. We will also learn the capital cities of the countries which make up the UK.



As **Musicians**, we will learn to listen and respond to music through *The Carnival of the Animals*. In Term 4, pupils will learn about rounds and performing in two parts, listening and responding to a range of 1600's music by composers such as William Byrd.

English

Non-fiction: Recounts / Instructions.

Fiction: Stories involving fantasy / Traditional tales from other cultures / Stories about the wild.

Poetry: The Senses / Humorous poems.

Grammar is taught within our English lessons.

Begin to use capital letters for proper nouns / Begin to use apostrophes for possession.

Spelling / Phonics

Common Exception words / Jolly Phonics and Jolly Grammar.



Maths

In Maths lessons, we will be focusing on the following areas:

- Number and Place Value
- Mental Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
- Problem Solving, Reasoning and Algebra.



Geometry

Properties of Shapes / Measurement / Position and Direction.



We revisit these areas many times over the year.

Science (enhanced using PZAZ and Explorify)

Uses of Everyday Materials

- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.
- Find out how the shape of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.
- About recycling – which materials can be recycled, the recycling process and why recycling is important.
- About some inventors – John McAdam & Charles Macintosh.



Computing Making music

We will learn how to create music digitally.

PE: PE will be focusing on movement and dance.
