Key Areas of Learning

As **historians**, we will find out about the Anglo-Saxon settlement and the struggle with the Vikings for the kingdom of England and how England became a unified country and led to the kingdom of England we know today.

We will find out about law and order in Anglo-Saxon times and across the ages. The children will reflect on their rights and responsibilities as citizens and understand the importance of the fundamental British values of democracy, rule of law, individual liberty, and the need for mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.

In **Geography**, we will be using our atlas skills to find places originally named by the Vikings and learn about what the Viking names meant relating this to the landscape as it is now and as it was at the time.

English

We will work on spelling rules and strategies and continue to learn the words stipulated in the National Curriculum spelling lists for Year 5&6 and we will follow the Grammar Syllabus.

All children will be involved in a daily shared/guided reading session.

In Comprehension, we will be practising our retrieval skills, continuing to develop our understanding of inference and beginning to think about predication skills.

During Writing, we will be using the book **Freedom for Bron** and our Anglo-Saxons and Vikings Topic to develop our descriptive writing skills, describing characters and creating settings and writing a diary entry. In addition, we will be writing kennings based on **Beowulf** and instructions on how to be an Anglo-Saxon.

Science

As scientists, we will be studying Living Things and their Habitats, learning about the classification of living things, including micro-organisms.

Computing

This term our key questions are: How can we use the World Wide Web to communicate? What is 3D modelling?

D&T

In Design and Technology, we will be making a range of bread products.

PE

PE will be on Tuesday afternoon and Friday morning. We will be doing football and hockey as well as preparing for the Partnership sporting events.

Maths

This term children in **Year 6** will cover the following topics:

- **Place Value:** counting in a range of multiples, counting through zero and solving problems with negative numbers, rounding any numbers, reading and writing Roman numerals to 1000, read, write order and compare all numbers, solving number and practical problems.
- **Addition & Subtraction:** add and subtract numbers, using rounding to estimate and approximate, use inverse operations, solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems.
- **Multiplication & Division:** multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000, identify multiples and factors, solve problems, multiply 4 digits by 2 digits, dividing using fractional and decimal quotients, understand and use order of operations.
- **Fractions:** simplify fractions, fractions on a number line, compare and order using denominator and numerator, add and subtract fractions, multiply fractions by whole numbers and fractions, divide fractions by whole numbers, find fractions of an amount, finding the whole.

Spanish

This year we are introducing Spanish. Learning to: Meet and Greet and My Body.

Music

In Music, we will be discovering the story of song, looking at how songs have evolved through history.

Art:

In **Art**, we will study the artists Georgia O'Keefe and Jacqueline Hurley, creating our own abstract and mixed media work.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be looking at the units *Me and My Relationships* and *Valuing Difference*.

RE: Our values this term are **Friendship** and **Thankfulness**.

This term we will be asking the questions; *Are you inspired?* And *Does God Communicate with man?*
